

Guide for participants

Dear conference participants, thank you for your interest and we would like to provide you with a guide to facilitate your stay in Prague as well as your participation in the conference itself.

Transportation

In Prague, you will find subway (metro), trams, and bus transport. The subway has three lines that have a total of 3 transfer points that you can use to transfer: Florenc (Cross station of Line C/red line + Line B/yellow line), Můstek (Line B/yellow + line A/green line) and Muzeum (Line C/red + Line A/green). Muzeum and Můstek stations are placed at the Václavské náměstí (Wenceslas Square). The subway map, which is below the text, is placed in each subway wagon.



Airport Transportation

There are two terminals (1 and 2) at the airport. In front of both terminals, you will find bus stops that will take you either to the metro stop Veleslavín (A green line, bus number 119) or Zličín (B yellow line, bus number 100). Or you can use BOLT or UBER. The price should be around 500 CZK (20 Euro) to the center (it depends on the time and workload of the drivers).

In order to know the departures, there is an IDOS application, created by MAFRA, and according to the settings in your system it should be displayed in English. If the language on your mobile system is not English, it will display in Czech, but it's an easy search. The top is the stop you want to go from, the bottom is the stop you want to go to. The best way to find out the name of the stop is to look up the address in Google Maps and when you click on the route icon (bus, tram, metro) it will show you the name of the stop. Bus departures are also written directly on the bus stops. Buses run more or less on time (+/- minutes).

<u>Tickets</u>

You can either buy tickets for transport in vending machines (they don't usually take debit or credit cards, just coins), There is one exception the machines at the Airport.

Or you can pay for transport on the bus - there's one specialized scanner in the middle of the bus, to which you put your card. But the problem occurs on a full bus, where you have to make your way to that particular scanner.

Or you can buy them in newsagents, most often the Relay brand, which is in almost every tube station outside the turnstile entrance. From the Airport we recommend buying 90-minute tickets.

Tickets at airport

Tickets can be purchased at the counter of the Transport Company (Dopravní podnik) directly in the Arrival Lounge, in the Visitor Centre, from the ticket machines in the Arrival Lounge, and at the stops or stations (most of them accept payment cards), or via SMS.

Prague city

The city of Hundred Towers, the mother of cities, and the golden Prague are the most famous attributes associated with the metropolis of the Czech Republic.

Prague attracts tourists with several important monuments and many cultural events. The most visited places include Prague Castle, Charles Bridge, Old Town Square with the Astronomical Clock, Petřín Tower, Vyšehrad, and the Dancing House. Since 1992, the historic center of Prague, covering an area of 866 hectares, has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

From a bird's eye view, the city's most beautiful views are offered by Prague's towers - the tower of the Old Town Hall, the Powder Tower, the Old Town Bridge Tower, the Lesser Town Bridge Tower or the Žižkov Transmitter.
