ICSJ Research Areas

Graduate Profile

(PhD) Programme P0321D180004: Media and Communication studies (DP_MCS and DK_MCS)

The study programme prepares students for independent academic work in the field of communication, media and marketing studies at universities, with substantial knowledge of communication and media theories and methodologies.

Graduate profile:

- Higher management degrees in media and other organizations (e.g. NGOs, government institutions, etc.)
- •Research and analytical departments of media agencies
- Academic and research staff
- School/out-of-school development of media education

Application and Entrance Exams

- Interested candidates should submit their applications, using the online application system, which will be open from 1st January to 30th April 2023.
 Interest in a particular Ph.D. project should be mentioned in the motivation letter, together with a more developed proposal on the PhD project.
 - Relevant information
 - Form for filing your dissertation project proposal
- Applicants will be evaluated according to:
 - Quality of the dissertation project max. 25 points
 - Discussion on the submitted dissertation project and list of literature max.
 15 points
 - TOTAL max of 40 points
- The members of the committee evaluate the individual categories of evaluation; the point sum is then averaged for each category and added up to get the final score. The point of admission is set by the Dean, taking into account the number of applicants seeking the entrance examination and the capacity of the faculty.

Study - Practical Aspects

- The study is governed by an Individual Study Plan, which the student draws up at the beginning of the study and continuously updates
- The student should consult with his or her supervisor all his or her study and publication progress.
- Monthly scholarship (for internal students)
 - CZK 10,500 (+ increase after State Doctoral Exam)
 - In case of non-fulfilment of obligations the scholarship is reduced

Regarding the studies:

- Yearly tuition of EUR 500
- *Visa application & <u>PVZP health insurance</u> (for non EU citizenship), accommodation (stay at dorms is highly recommended)
 - *Visa application process:
 - Non EU citizenship must apply for visa <u>long term residence permit for the purpose of "studies"</u> and extend it yearly to stay in Czechia (mainly needs accommodation contract, document confirming the study, health insurance, & travel document)
 - Visa application process takes approx. 1 6 months long
 - After visa application is accepted, student has to show PVZP health insurance when taking the visa

Other funding opportunities

- SVV funds with a certain amount mainly to support student for conference, study abroad, summer school, and literature purchase. It is easy to apply and a great chance for Ph.D. students to get it.
 - (e.g, some PhD students get funded for conferences, summer schools, & study abroad)
- Mobility & POINT funds
- GAUK grants with a certain amount for research, conferences, and summer school
- Rewards for publications (e.g., Angga got financial rewards for two publications)
- Scholarship for teaching and research activity (e.g., Angga got scholarship for teaching a class)
- Increasing stipendium for teaching assistance
- Rewards for above-standard performance
- <u>Internships abroad</u> (Erasmus, CEEPUS, inter-university agreements, freemovers)

Graduation Requirements

- Attendance on at least two academic conferences, one of which should be national (Czech) and one international;
- Publication of three scholarly texts during their studies: at least one text needs to be a peer-reviewed article, and at least two must have the PhD student as the single author (they may thus be co-author of one);
- Successfully submitted grant application, or at least two unsuccessfully submitted grant applications;
- Teaching assistance at ICSJ FSS CU;
- Active cooperation with foreign academic institutions abroad (a minimum of one month abroad in total);
- Passing the Compulsory Courses;
- Passing the State Doctoral Exam;
- Small and main dissertation defence.
